

The warmer weather is wonderful and is a needed break from winter. The winter coats, pants and sweatshirts are replaced by short sleeve shirts, shorts and skirts. Students are reminded to dress appropriately for the school environment.

STUDENT DRESS CODE POLICY

Students are expected to dress appropriately for all school activities. The limits that are imposed relate to health, safety, cleanliness, distraction or indecency. Students are asked to refrain from wearing or displaying inappropriate or vulgar slogans. Dress and grooming styles that create a disruption of the total learning process in the classroom or school are not allowed.

For example:

- Halter tops and shirts must cover both the front and back to the top of the pants or shorts.
- Girls should use a double finger width for top straps.
- Undergarments should not be visible.
- Pants need to be worn at waist level.
- Shorts and skirts must be mid-thigh in length.
- Tube tops must have an additional shoulder cover.

No student shall be permitted to wear the following:

- 1) gang-affiliated clothing, jewelry, or identification will not be tolerated (e.g., gang-related colors);
- 2) clothing that contains pictures and/or writing referring to alcoholic beverages, tobacco products, sexual references, profanity and/or illegal drugs;
- 3) bikini tops, bikini "type" tops, and halter tops showing a bare midriff--no bare midriffs;
- 4) jackets or coats, unless the weather is such that the heating system of the school is unable to maintain a comfortable level of warmth;
- 5) hats or headgear of any sort except for special activity days as approved by the principal;
- 6) shirts and shoes must be worn at all times; and
- 7) shirts must be worn with head through the neck and arms through the sleeves.

Discretion of what is excessive or in bad taste will be left up to faculty and administration, as defined by the Wisconsin Statute 120.13
